We will welcome our first class of Grade 9 students in 2022 and will build through Grade 12 in subsequent years.

Our Program

Stratford Preparatory provides a future-focused and purpose-driven curriculum, a team of highly skilled teachers and mentors, access to a wide range of partnerships, co-curricular activities, and a supportive school culture that fosters an enduring culture of joyful learning.

Our specialized and challenging curriculum provides students with breadth, depth, flexibility, and a combination of a customizable course catalog and shared student experiences. Our course offerings include learning priorities in both traditional disciplines and modern multidisciplinary studies, foundational subject courses, and a wide selection of Honors, Advanced Placement (AP), and college-level Stratford Advanced Studies (SAS) courses.

Honors Courses

Most of Stratford Preparatory's foundational courses are only offered at the honors level, building upon the advanced design of our Stratford Middle School program.

AP and Stratford Advanced Studies

Stratford Preparatory offers Advanced Placement (AP) and Stratford Advanced Studies (SAS) courses. We recognize the value of the AP as a gold-standard program for college admissions. We also believe that, in some cases, there are opportunities to expand the scope and rigor of instruction for some of our Stratford students. Therefore, we have developed SAS courses that set a standard for student learning that exceeds that of the *College Board* in select disciplines and prepares students for university-level classwork and culture.

All students are empowered and encouraged to pursue their interests as far as their skill levels allow them to go. Our skilled teachers design these flexible courses in ways that challenge, interrogate, and combine the deepest possible critical understanding with the most rigorously challenging application of those concepts and skills.

Distinctive Experiences



Community of Belonging and Purpose

Stratford is a welcoming and inclusive community that seeks to reflect the diversity of Silicon Valley and encourages the exchange of multiple perspectives, experiences, and life stories.

We prioritize belonging by starting from a place of inclusion: Each student's whole, beautiful, complex self is appropriate and accepted. Through a purposeful variety of activities and programming, we teach students that self-identity and acceptance are at the root of our agency and self-worth, neither of which are up for negotiation. We help students discover and affirm their unique identities, build on those identities by helping to instill a sense of belonging and purpose, and building their confidence in their uniqueness with a broad range of leadership and learning opportunities.

IMPACT Capstone

In Grade 12, our students will dive deeply into an area of emerging academic passion through a self-directed research project culminating in IMPACT Capstone. Students will be guided by a teacher mentor in Trimester 1 and 2 and execute the project in Trimester 3. IMPACT Capstone allows students to design, plan, and conduct a mentored research project or internship on an academic or real-world topic of their choosing.

During their IMPACT Capstone project, Stratford students will take two required courses, incorporating significant problem- and projectbased experiences: 1) Advanced Creativity, Innovation and Transformation, and 2) Advanced Living Responsibly: Philosophy, Ethics, and Technology (course details included in Specialized Multidisciplinary Courses).

Both courses will consolidate and deepen our Stratford students' understanding of the concepts, mental models, themes, and thinking routines that they have developed in their earlier years at Stratford, as well as introduce to them new, more advanced topics and questions.

Accelerated Computer Science

Stratford's Preschool – Grade 8 computer science program establishes a strong foundation for the various advanced courses available in the Stratford High School curriculum. Stratford's High School also provides opportunities for students without a computer science background to take introductory courses and progress rapidly in the field. Stratford Preparatory students seeking a degree or profession in computer science and engineering have a specific pathway with advanced courses offered as early as Grade 9 and 10, which aligns with their mathematics and science courses. Courses include both Advanced Placement (AP) and Stratford Advanced Studies (SAS) courses.

Graduation Requirements

Stratford's graduation requirements exceed entrance standards for highly selective colleges, including the University of California.

1 credit = 1 trimester of study



Traditional Disciplines

Mathematics (9 credits)

Minimum through Honors Precalculus including topics in Probability & Statistics, Discrete & Comp Math. AP Stats & Data Science is an additional requirement.

English Language and Literature (12 credits) Honors English 1 & 2, Honors English Seminar, *AP Literature & Composition.*

Science (9 credits) Honors Biology (including Biotech), Honors Chemistry (including Nanotech), Honors Physics (including Cleantech).

History and Civics (6 credits) AP World History and Honors American History and Government.

World Languages (6 credits) Minimum of two sequential years of one core language through *Level 3*.

Visual and Performing Arts (4 credits) Students must demonstrate proficiency in an arts area by completing 4 credits in the same studio.

Health, Physical Education (HPE) and Athletics (2 credits)

Completion of *HPE 1* and *HPE 2*. Additional health seminars, interscholastic teams, intramural teams, and outside fitness or sports training may be credited.

Multidisciplinary Studies

Social Systems (3 credits) *Advanced Social Systems* (integrated course in Psychology, Sociology, and Anthropology).

Technology and Engineering (4 credits) Future of Computing and Advanced Living Responsibly: Philosophy, Ethics, and Technology.

Business and Entrepreneurship (4 credits) Business and Entrepreneurship and Advanced Creativity, Innovation and Transformation.

Impact Project (5-6 credits) Students complete a trimester-long independent project in Grade 12.

Expert Instructors

Inspiring and skillful teachers are the most meaningful factor influencing a student's scholastic achievements. Our Stratford teachers are curious, kind, and authentic subject experts. College Counselors provide a comprehensive four-year program, including group and individual counseling, that helps our students navigate the college application process from a place of empowerment.

Flex Time in our daily schedule allows for students to practice some added agency over their time at school, and enables teachers to offer office hours and provide students with personalized academic support.

Our program places an emphasis on the application of complex knowledge and advanced skills, hands-on experimentation, creative projects, and independent research in real-world settings.







Creative Expression

Programs in the Arts provide students with opportunities to develop and practice their craft, developing unique style and voice, while realizing the societal and global significance of the arts.

Stratford has always considered the arts to be an integral part of a complete education as a means to understand and communicate the human experience. Building upon signature features of our choice-based Middle School program, Stratford Preparatory will offer various studios, modeled off a classical approach to artistic study. Schedule

Stratford Preparatory's schedule includes a mix of standard (60 minute) and extended (80 minute) periods to accommodate advanced lab investigations, art creation, extended discussions, debates or projects, or other learning experiences that benefit from larger blocks of uninterrupted time.

The Stratford Preparatory School day will begin at 8:30 a.m. We have chosen a "later" start time, based on overwhelming research that shows how more sleep is beneficial to young people's health and performance in school.

Every day includes a Flex Time that is used for community gatherings, advisory, and teacher office hours.

When designing our High School program, we talked with leading colleges and universities about what they were looking for in prospective students. We closely studied the admission requirements for critical degree specializations and identified leading partners to support us in our design including:

- Charles Fadel and his team at the Center for Curriculum Redesign. Charles is a global thought leader, educational expert, and futurist, visiting scholar at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. He's worked with educational systems and schools in more than thirty countries and with major organizations like the Gates Foundation, World Bank, and the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development. He was formerly the Global Education Lead at Cisco Systems.
- Project Wayfinder, founded at the Stanford Design Institute, is a network and systematic curriculum focused on student mental health, social, emotional, and ethical learning.
