

KIVA Club

Kiva is a non profit organization that helps people through granting microloans to become economically independent. Five years ago we started our cross curricular 8th grade Living On One Dollar/Kiva project which hopefully we will have the opportunity to continue this year. The goal of this project is to raise students' awareness about microfinancing and to develop empathy, compassion, a sense of community, and responsibility. Our students have raised over \$7,400 in the past five years and they have made a total of 1,183 loans, re-lending the initial money to a total of \$29,875 in loans. When a loan is repaid, the money initially lent, is returned to our account in order to lend the money to a new borrower. This way, our students are not doing a one time contribution only, but rather these funds remain in our school account to be lent to new borrowers by our students now and in the future. In addition, we also have donated more than \$3,300 to KIVA. Students who join the club will:

- -Learn about microfinancing and strategies to choose potential borrowers based on a number of variables while at the same time learning about other cultures and realities of their lives, understanding poverty and its impact around the world.
- -Plan and execute fundraising events at school to collect funds to help alleviate poverty around the world "one loan at a time.".
- -Make a Newsletter (every 3 months) to share the status of our Kiva loans and borrowers.
